Anu loves all her colourful socks. But sometimes, Ma needs to use them.




Ma uses the socks to make mops. Anu doesn't like that her socks are used as mops.

If you want colourful feet, wear colourful socks. There are so many colours to choose from!




One day, Anu has an idea.


