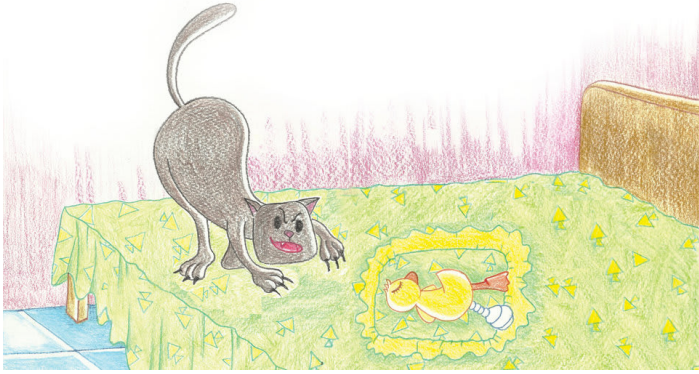
Nichchumani Helps Out
